MINUTES:

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Bullard to approve and place on file the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of February 19, 1985. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Little, to approve and place on file the Minutes of the Special Meeting of February 28, 1985 after amending paragraph 6 to read the monthly maintenance contract on the computer will be \$220 per month, and amend Paragraph 7 to show 1 nay vote - Allen. Motion declared carried. 1 nay - J. Watkins. R. Watkins abstained.

PLANNING & ZONING:

Moved by Allen, seconded by J. Watkins, to place on file the Minutes of the Planning & Zoning Commission Meeting of February 26, 1985.
Motion declared carried.

Moved by R. Watkins, seconded by Washom, to allow a home Occupation License for Judy Stapleton (Judy's Plaster & Gifts) at 611 E. 5th St. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Washom, seconded by Anderson, to allow a home Occupation License for Bud Piercefield at 100 West Sparks for a small motor repair shop. Motion declared carried.

HELEN LEWIS - 1102 SHORT:

Helen Lewis reported the progress on 1102 Short, completed except for trim and paint on outside. Gene Porter stated he realized the weather had not permitted them to paint the outside, and that he would inspect it as soon as she called that it was completed. Moved by J. Watkins, seconded by R. Watkins, to allow 30 days for completion. Motion declared carried.

ANNEXATION:

Moved by Little, seconded by Bullard to table procedures for annexation until the next meeting when the City Attorney could be present. Motion declared carried.

PRIMARY ELECTION ORDINANCE:

Moved by Allen, seconded by Washom to make a Charter Ordinance to repeal the current Charter Ordinance concerning Primary Elections. Motion declared carried.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Moved by J. Watkins, seconded by Anderson, to purchase a repeater for the radios in the Fire Department for better communications with the station during fires. The Fire Department is willing to pay half the expense, the City's share of the cost will be \$750. Motion declared carried.

AMBULANCE BUILDING:

Moved by Little, seconded by Washom, to take bids on the replacement of the roof at the Ambulance Building at 503 Main. Motion declared carried.

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VEHICLE INSPECTION:

Moved by Little, seconded by Anderson, to enter into an agreement with the State for the Police Department to start doing the Vehicle inspections required by the State for vehicles purchased out of State. The Police Department will keep \$9 of each \$10 collected and the money will be used for Equipment and Education in the Police Department. Motion declared carried.

BULLET PROOF VESTS:

Moved by Colgrove, seconded by Little to approve the purchase of 5 bullet proof vests at \$235.75 each and 1 XXL at \$287.75 for the Police Department. Motion declared carried. 1-nay - J. Watkins.

UNIFORMS FOR DISPATCHERS:

Moved by Washom, seconded by Little to purchase uniforms for the 4 full time dispatchers in the Police Department. The dispatchers will pay half the cost of 3 uniforms and the city will pay half. The City's share will be \$297.00 Roll Call Vote indicated:

4 - yeas - Little, Colgrove, Anderson, Washom 4 - nays - Bullard, J. Watkins, Allen, R. Watkins

2 - absent - King, Gibson Mayor broke tie with yea vote. Motion declared carried.

REPAIR 11TH STREET:

Moved by J. Watkins, seconded by R. Watkins, to allow Jarvis to purchase 80' of 36" metal pipe at \$24.78 per foot to repair 11th Street west of Dewey which was washed out during high water. Motion declared carried.

ASPHALT FOR WOOD STREET:

Moved by J. Watkins, seconded by Anderson, to allow Jarvis to purchase asphalt to repair Wood Street between 21st and 24th Streets. Motion declared carried.

BIDS ON TRUCKS:

Moved by Washom, seconded by Anderson, to take bids to sell a 1949 Chevrolet $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton truck and a 1971 Ford $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton dump truck. Bids to be in by March 29. Motion declared carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Little reported Court receipts for February showed \$1975.00 was collected for fines.

Little moved to give the Stockmarshal a key for the gas pumps. Motion died for lack of second.

PURCHASE LAWNMOWERS:

Moved by J. Watkins, seconded by Washom to purchase 2 Wheelhorse riding mowers for \$3544 for the Park and Cemetery, also a Lazyboy 4 H.P. push mower for the Cemetery, 1 for Park and 1 for the City Shop at \$205.00 each. Motion declared carried.

Moved by R. Watkins, seconded by Anderson, to purchase a weedcater for the Cemetery and 1 for the Park at \$160.00 each. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Allen, seconded by Colgrove to purchase a hand held sprayer for the Cemetery and 1 for the park, and 10 gallon Primatol from Baxter Co-Op for weed control. Motion declared carried
