The deed had not been transferred at Columbus and she took back possession of the property. She requested the bill be waived since they were buying the house from her on contract and not renting it.

Chief Abram was asked about the vehicles at 5th & Galena Ave. He requested a meeting with the police committee to discuss this prior to open discussion. This was granted.

Gene Porter reported Larry Martin had obtained a building permit for repairs on the house at 7th & Water. He sent Mr. Martin a letter requesting him to be present at the April 19 Council Meeting to let the council know what he intends to do and the length of time it will take for the repairs.

Moved by Byrd, seconded by Anderson for the City to offer a \$500 reward for the arrest and conviction of individuals involved in the vandalism of City Police Vehicles and to advertise this in the newspaper. Motion declared carried.
