MINUTES OF THE GALENA CITY COUNCIL, GALENA, KANSAS, NOVEMBER 7, 1967

The council of the city of Galena met in regular session in the council chamber at the city hall at 7:00 p.m., November 7, 1967.

Barnes, Marshal Hamlin, and City Clerk Chesnutt.

Invocation: Mayor Dillon

Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Karr, that the reading of the previous meeting be dispensed with and that same stand approved as presented in writing to the Governing Body. Motion carried viva voce.

Bob Murphy, Sales Representative of the Blue Cross - Blue Shield of Kansas, presented a bid for group hospitalization for the year of 1968. No action was taken on the matter but taken under advisement by the General Committee.

Councilman Piercefield moved, seconded by Councilman Pittman, that the Elks Club be granted to use city property located at the City Market to hold a turkey shoot on November 18 and December 19, in sofar as they assumed the responsibility and took the necessary steps needed for the safety of the public. Motion carried on roll call vote as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None.

Councilman Watkins moved, seconded by Councilman Piercefield, that the Mayor be granted the authority to handle the matter of Robert Ruhl recently fined \$30 and costs of \$10 in police court as he deemed necessary in compliance with Mayor C. C. Haynes', Mayor of Joplin, Missouri, request. On roll call the vote was as follows: Yeas - Councilman Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. Motion declared passed by Mayor Dillon.

Councilman Piercefield moved, seconded by Councilman Karr, that necessary repairs on the City Building be placed on bid. O_n roll call the vote was as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. Passage of the motion was declared by the Chair.

Councilman Piercefield presented the City Marshalls Report for the month of October, 1967, totaling \$2,330. Councilman Piercefield moved, seconded by Councilman Watkins, that the report be accepted and placed on file in the City Clerk's Office. Motion carried by a show of hands.

Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Coucilman Piercefield, that the fencing around the Pump Station, located at 10th and Wood, approximately 1,080, with 6 ft. link fence, 3-strand barb wire, be placed on bid. On roll call the vote was as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. Passage of the motion was declared by Mayor Dillon.

Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Piercefield, that the city attorney be instructed to draw an ordinance to raise the water deposit on all meters to \$15.00 effective from publication of same. On roll call the vote was as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. The motion was declared passed.

Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Karr, that a water line from 21st and Wood Streets to the State Line Road and then north to the property owned by Sander whenever time permited, size of the line to be determined by the Planning and Zoning Commission. Motion carried on roll call vote as follows: Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman - Yeas. Nays - None. Motion declared passed by Mayor Dillon.

Following a brief discussion, Councilman Watkins moved, seconded by Councilman Pittman, that the City Clerk be instructed to write a letter to the County Commissioners requesting their services in maintaining the City Dump of Galena in that they had given assistance to the City of Columbus by grading and cleaning their Dump. Motion carried on roll call vote as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. Motion declared passed by the Chair.

The city attorney was requested to determine the legality of the City removing trees from the parkways throughout the city.

Superintendent Barnes presented a monthly report on the Waterworks. Following same, Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Karr, that the report be accepted as read and placed on file within the City Clerk's Office. Motion carried via show of hands.

Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Watkins, that six (6) meters be purchased from Joplin Supply Company and six (6) meters returned to the firm. Motion carried on roll call vote as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. Motion declared passed.

Councilman Karr moved, seconded by Councilman Pittman, that the cemetery superintendent be granted authority to purchase a tractor not to exceed the cost of \$1,395 for use within the Cemetery Department. The roll call vote was as follows: Yeas - Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - Kitch. The motion was declared lost.

Councilman Karr moved, seconded by Councilman Watkins, that a 15-minute parking sign be painted on the sidewalk at Fith and Main for the use of customers using the public telephone booth. Motion carried by a show of hands.

Councilman Karr moved, seconded by Councilman Watkins, that a 10-minute sign be painted on the sidewalk on the north side of the City Building and reserving two parking spaces for use of the Police Department. Motion carried by a show of hands.

Councilman Karr brought the attention of the Governing Body to two newly installed lights in the Courtroom and one in the Mayor's Office.

Councilman Watkins introduced the following resolution:

Councilman Watkins moved, seconded by Councilman Pittman, that the foregoing resolution be approved by roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously as follows: Yeas - Councilmen Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, Pittman. Nays - None. Passage of the motion was declared by Mayor Dillon.

Councilman Watkins introduced Ordinance No. 536, an ordinance for making payment of certain claims; the meeting being public the ordinance was discussed and amended. On roll call the ordinance was approved as follows: Yeas - Councilmen Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman.

Councilman Pittman introduced an ordinance relating to water bills, time of payment thereof and penalty for non-payment of same which was given the number of 847. Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Piercefield, that the ordinance be amended to include meter rates for installation of the meter being a \$15 deposit replacing the current \$10 deposit on residential meters. Motion carried. Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Piercefield, that the foregoing ordinance No. 847 be approved and placed on roll call vote for passage. On roll call the following vote was recorded: Yeas - Councilmen Piercefield, Watkins, Cure, Kitch, Karr, and Pittman. Nays - None. Passage of the ordinance was declared by Mayor Dillon.

Mayor Dillon requested the City Clerk to read complaints received by her office regarding streets as follows: Willard Thiry, East Fourth, requested the road be graded as he had entered this complaint for the past two months; Mrs. Ed Tollman, 905 Elm, wanted the street between Eight and Ninth Streets to be dug out as they were clogged up and no drainage was available; Price & Faringer, 306 Main, reported the street was very dirty on the west side throughout the week and requested that it be cleaned. Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Watkins, that the complaints be spread upon and entered into the minutes and that a copy of the minutes be issued to Mr. Barnes. Motion carried viva voce.

The city attorney advised the Governing Body that trial was set for Saturday morning at 10 o'clock regarding complaint received by the city from Mrs. McCumber.

Councilman Pittman moved, seconded by Councilman Karr, that the meeting be adjourned as no further business was at hand. Motion carried via a show of hands.
