- The rezoning of property at 115 E. Empire from R-1 to C-2, and vacating a street at 17<sup>th</sup> and Dewey was denied on recommendations of the Planning & Zoning minutes of November 13, 2001.

City Manager, Jack Murray announced the city should take in about \$5400.00 after expenses from the auction of the confiscated vehicles in the impound lot.


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ADJOURNMENT:
