EPA:

Mark Doolan with EPA spoke to the commission on putting sludge from Springfield on 28 acres behind city hall. He stated all the cities around here have a problem of disposal of sludge, and they hope to show this is a good resource to rehabilitate old mining areas. Mr. Doolan stated there should be little problem with odor.

Motion made by Oglesby, seconded by Brandenburg to allow the EPA to utilize the city's 28 acres behind city hall. Motion declared carried.

COOPER MALONE MCCLAIN

Robert Davis with Cooper Malone McClain Inc. stated he needed a Resolution passed which gives the city authority to issue revenue bonds. He advised the resolution states that the city meets all requirements by state statue and as a city has the right to issue bonds to pay for sewer improvements. The amount of bonds issued would be \$355,000.00. Mr. Davis stated the resolution would need to be published and allow 15 days for a protest period.

Commissioner Oglesby asked what interest rate was the city going to end up with. Mr. Davis stated the interest rate would be approximately 5.65% for 15 years.

Motion made by Jackson, seconded by Oglesby to pass resolution 99-15 to issue revenue bonds.

City Attorney, Mike Goodrich stated anything over \$300.00 required three bids.

Motion made by Jackson, seconded by Webster to purchase the 87 Ford PU from Joe LaGorda in the amount of \$1900.00 to be utilized at the city barn. Motion declared carried.
