CALL TO ORDER:

VACATION PAY:

Moved by Gibson, seconded by Washom, to approve one weeks pay in lieu of vacation for Barbara Wilkins. Motion declared carried.

ATKINSON BORING CONTRACT:

A contract is to be sent to Atkinson Boring to pay \$37.00 per ft. for 30-35 feet of boring under highway on South main for installing a new water line. The verba price had been mistaken for \$27.00 a foot.

MOBILE HOME ORD.:

Moved by Little, seconded by Gibson, that a draft amendment for the placement of mobile homes be turned over to the Planning & Zoning Commission at their next Regular meeting in February so they can set a hearing for their March meeting. A show of hands indicated 5 - nay votes: Anderson, J. Watkins, R. Watkins, Bullard, Allen. Motion declared failed.

Moved by Allen, seconded by J. Watkins, that this mobile home proposal go back to the Council Committee that had been previously appointed. Motion declared carried. (Little voted nay)

CITY PRIMARY ELECTION:

City Attorney, Chris Meek, informed the council that he had contacted the Attorney Generals office concerning the City's Charter Ordinance doing away with the City Primary Election and that the A G's office said the law was uniformly applicable to all cities and therefore you could not charter out from the State Law. The City will have a Primary Election on February 26, 1985.
