

MINUTES OF  
SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING  
FEBRUARY 15, 1990

CALL TO ORDER:

The Special Meeting of the Galena City Council was called to order at 7:00 P.M. on Thursday, February 15, 1990 in the Council Chambers with Thomas Y. Allen, Mayor, presiding. Purpose of the special meeting was to have a public meeting concerning TriStates Recycling and Transfer constructing a plant on Old Highway 66 just West of the State Line.

OPEN MEETING:

Mayor Allen opened the meeting and asked Mr. Duane Snapp of TriStates Recycling to make an opening statement.

Mr. Snapp explained the process of handling the product coming into the plant. He showed samples of the products that will be recycled and the fluff that will be taken to the landfill. He stated that he has agreed not to handle more than 500 ton per day.

Questions were answered from Skip Scott, Lea Price, Lloyd Parkes, Jim Montee and others.

Many of the questions concerned the trash being taken to the landfill from out of state, and the ownership of the landfill.

Mr. Snapp stated he is meeting with the County Commissioners on Tuesday, February 20, at 9:00 A.M. to settle this question.

There being no further questions, Mayor Allen closed the public hearing.
