

REVENUE SHARING AND SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING - July 31, 1979

An open meeting of the governing body of the City of Galena was held Tuesday, July 31, 1979, to hear protest and suggestions on the expenditure of \$68,609.00 of Revenue Sharing Funds, appropriated in the 1980 City Budget.

Suggestions made for use of the money were to buy a new police vehicle, and make much needed repairs to the swimming pool.

Following the Revenue Sharing hearing, a special council meeting was called to order by Mayor Williams, for the purpose of approving the hourly pay roll.

Council members present were Hall, Piercefield, Kelley, Cure, Faulkner, Smith and Hayes. Bailey, Davies and Hopkins were not present.


Smith moved that payroll ordinance No. 79-17, be approved. Piercefield seconded the motion. Motion Carried.

On motion by Piercefield, seconded by Smith, the payroll of Community Development, was also approved.

Mayor Williams asked members of the council to consider change in the method of paying employees, so as not to be approving pay in advance, and yet allowing the employees to receive their pay without having to wait several days for council approval.

The council decided to meet Thursday, August 2, in special session to consider recent developments in the Community Development office.

On motion by Piercefield, seconded by Faulkner, the council meeting adjourned.
