ORDINANCE NO. 82-3

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 989,  
CONCERNING DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE AND AUTHORIZING THEM TO BE  
SHOT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GALENA:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to own, harbor or keep a dog or dogs on the public streets or alleys of the City of Galena, Kansas, or to permit any such animal to, at any time, run at large on or upon any premises other than the premises of the owner, harborer or keeper of such dog or dogs. If a dog is found at large, and pound-master or police officer is unable to catch and restrain such dog, such officer is hereby authorized and directed to shoot the dog, if the shooting thereof will not endanger the life or property of others.

SECTION 2. That this ordinance shall be effective and in full force from and after its approval and publication in the official city newspaper, The Galena Sentinel-Times.
