

ORDINANCE NO. 84-7

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING CRIMINAL TRESPASS, PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTY THEREOF AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 949 AND NO. 1013 IN THEIR ENTIRETY AND ANY AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GALENA, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: Definition. Criminal trespass is entering or remaining upon or in any land, structure, vehicle, aircraft or watercraft by a person who knows he or she is not authorized or privileged to do so, and;

- (a) Such persons enters or remains therein in defiance of an order not to enter or to leave such premises or property personally communicated to such person by the owner thereof or other authorized person; or
- (b) such premises or property are posted in a manner reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders, or are locked or fenced or otherwise enclosed, or shut or secured against passage or entry.


SECTION 2: Penalty. Any person, upon conviction in the Municipal Court of the City of Galena, Kansas, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined a sum of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or confined in jail for a definite term not to exceed ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3: Ordinance number 949 and 1013 and any other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.


SECTION 4: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force after its passage and publication in the official City newspaper, The Galena Sentinel-Times.
